

Prescription Card Breakdown

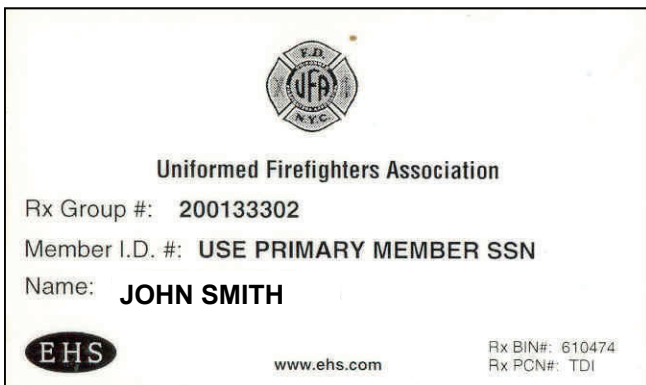
It is of extreme importance that Members being treated for WTC ailments (i.e. - GERD, acid reflux, sinusitis, mental health, etc.) fill these prescriptions using the WTC Prescription Card instead of the UFA Prescription Card.

The WTC Prescription Card has been underutilized to date. If you haven't received it, call the WTC Medical Monitoring and Treatment Program at 718-999-1858 to be issued a new card. Keep in mind that if you are an active firefighter, you must have had at least one annual medical since August 2005 to be eligible for this program.

To make things easier to understand, we've created a Sample of each Prescription Card. Each sample will show what the Prescription Card looks like and what it should be used for. We're also providing contact phone numbers if you need to request replacement cards or if you have any questions about eligibility.

The main prescription card is the UFA / SBF Prescription Card - it should be used by Firefighters and their families for non-LOD prescriptions. WTC-related Prescriptions should be claimed with the WTC Prescription card. The PICA Card has now become the "IC" card and is only used for injectables and chemotherapy prescriptions (Please note, deductibles and co-pays are involved.)

UFA /SBF Prescription Card - Front



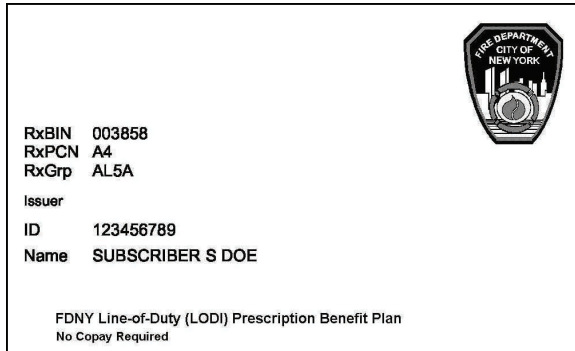
UFA /SBF Prescription Card - Back

LODI Prescription Card - Front

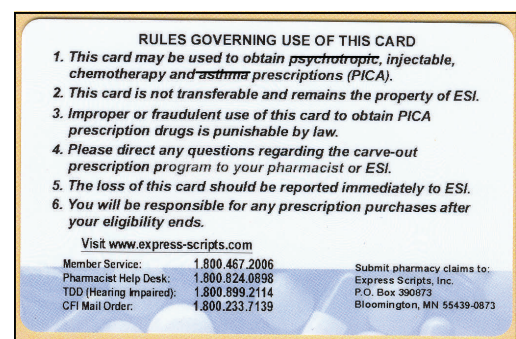
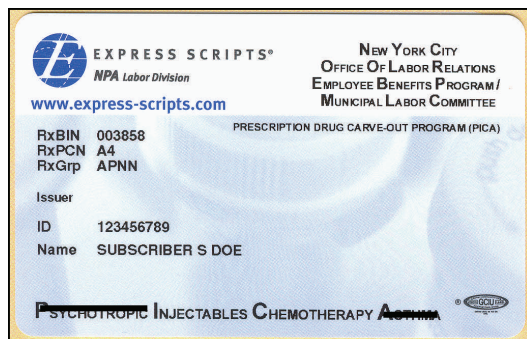
LODI Prescription Card - Back

Active Firefighters use for Line of Duty - Related Medications. Family members are not eligible for this card. Co-pay is \$0. No out-of-pocket expenses for Members.

Members will receive more detailed instructions on how to handle LODI Prescriptions. Instructions will be mailed to Members' home addresses. Please ensure your contact information is up to date with both FDNY HQ and the UFA.

Active and Retired Firefighters use for interjectable and chemotherapy . New cards are issued on an as-needed or as-requested basis. Co-pays and deductibles are in effect.

If a Member elects to "Opt-Out" of their medical coverage (because they are covered by a spouse's medical benefits), then they will opt-out of this prescription coverage as well. Questions? FDNY's WTC Medical Monitoring & Treatment Program

NEW Satellite Offices

As a result of collaboration between Sgt-at-Arms Bill Romaka, the UFA Executive Board Members, and Drs. Kelly and Prezant, the FDNY has expanded its ability to treat active and retired Members. The FDNY has opened a satellite office on Staten Island for active and retired Members who are participants in the WTC Medical Monitoring & Treatment Program. If you are a retiree and recently had a WTC Medical Monitoring exam, or if you are active and recently had your Company Medical, you may be eligible to visit a satellite office.

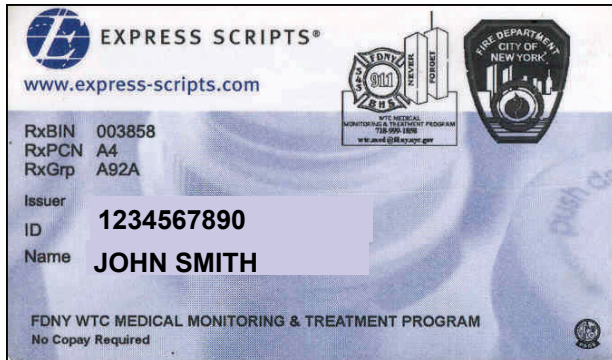
These satellite offices will not be used for duty determination and will not perform actual medicals, focusing instead primarily on lung issues, GERD, sinus and mental health issues. The satellite offices will also be able to provide active and retired Members with WTC-related prescriptions.

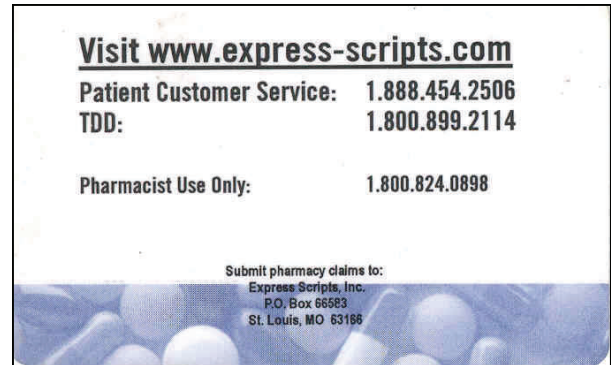

Active and Retired Firefighters use for WTC-Related Medications (Respiratory, GERD, acid reflux, sinusitis, mental health - including depression or PTSD, etc.). Prescriptions must be provided by WTC Treatment Doctors (available at BHS and at Satellite Treatment locations). Most prescriptions will be filled electronically by these doctors. Therefore, presenting the prescription card may not be necessary when filling WTC-Related prescriptions at these locations. Family members are not eligible for this card. Co-pay is \$0.

Haven't received a card? If you're Active, you are covered if you were active on 9/11 and you have had at least 1 company medical since August of 2005. For more information on the WTC Medical Monitoring program, or to make an appointment for a qualifying medical, call 718-999-0221.
